




The mobility activities target diverse participant groups, including **students, trainees, apprentices, adult learners,** and **young people,** fostering improvements in learning, employability, and career prospects.

Jean Monnet Actions, operating within Erasmus+, aim to stimulate teaching, learning, research, and debates **on the European Union.** This includes funding opportunities for schools and vocational education institutions, supporting teachers to inform and develop critical awareness about the EU among young people. The actions cover both education and vocational training. Additionally, higher education institutions actions focus on supporting teaching and research in European Union studies globally, emphasizing the EU dimension from both internal and global perspectives. The scope of EU studies aims to promote active European citizenship, values, and awareness of the EU's role in a globalized world, facilitating future engagement and people-to-people dialogue.

Higher Education Opportunities

The higher education mobility initiative supports the physical and blended mobility of students across all study fields and levels, including short cycle, bachelor, master, and doctoral programmes.

Students can engage in either studying abroad at partner institutions or undertaking internships in various work environments abroad. The option to combine a study period with a traineeship is also encouraged, enhancing overall learning outcomes and transversal skill development. Emphasis on the value of long-term physical mobility.
Acknowledges the importance of flexible durations for accessibility.
Ensures inclusivity for students from diverse backgrounds and circumstances.

In addition to student mobility, the action extends its support to higher education teaching and administrative staff, enabling them to participate in professional development activities abroad. Moreover, staff from the world of work are encouraged to contribute by teaching or training students and staff at higher education institutions, encompassing various activities such as job shadowing, observation periods, and training courses.



Furthermore, the action promotes blended intensive programmes, facilitating collaborative efforts among higher education institutions to develop curricula and activities for blended mobility involving students, academic staff, and administrative personnel.

Studying Abroad

ERASMUS facilitates student and doctoral candidate exchanges within countries fully part of the Erasmus+ programme and to and from countries associated with it. By studying abroad with Erasmus+, students can enhance their communication, language, and intercultural skills while gaining valuable soft skills recognized by future employers. The opportunity to combine a study period abroad with a traineeship for work experience is also available to students at short cycle Bachelor and Master levels and Doctoral candidates.

To be eligible, students must be registered in a higher education institution, enrolled in studies leading to a recognized degree or tertiary-level qualification, and have a relevant study abroad period as part of their degree-related learning.

Traineeships Abroad for Students

ERASMUS supports traineeships abroad for students enrolled in higher education institutions in Programme Countries at short-cycle Bachelor and Master levels, including doctoral candidates and recent graduates.

Benefits of traineeships for students include the development of entrepreneurial and creative skills. Traineeships improve foreign language skills and provide a deeper understanding of another country and culture. •For companies, hosting a trainee brings new perspectives, innovative ideas, increased competitiveness, and access to new markets.

Erasmus+ supports traineeships for a duration of 2 to 12 months, and individuals can also engage in blended mobility, combining a short physical stay abroad with a virtual period.

ERASMUS is a catalyst for elevating the quality of youth work and providing invaluable **non-formal learning experiences** through available funding for organizations and informal groups of young people. Within the programme, **young individuals** have the chance to embark on mobility activities in Europe and beyond, fostering personal growth and intercultural experiences. Simultaneously, **youth workers** can enhance their skills and competencies through dedicated training and networking activities.

Beyond individual development, Erasmus+ actively supports meaningful interactions between policymakers and young people, encouraging active participation in democratic life. This multifaceted programme serves as a gateway to fostering a dynamic and engaged youth community while promoting the values of education, collaboration, and democratic participation.

Young individuals have the opportunity to engage with numerous youth projects either by participating as individuals in funded projects or by directly applying for funding. Applications can be done individually, as part of an **informal youth group**, or through an **institution**, aligning with the specific criteria outlined by the respective projects.

Accessible to individuals aged 13 to 30, with group leaders required to be at least 18 years old.

Management is overseen by youth organizations, informal groups, or relevant entities.

Financial support for youth exchanges is provided through EU grants, covering travel expenses, practical needs, and activity-related costs essential for the success of the exchange.

Participation in a youth exchange involves an application process conducted by organizations or groups of young people. Notably, individual applications for grants are not accepted, and organizations or groups are responsible for applying and selecting participants for the exchange.

Youth Exchanges

YOUTH EXCHANGES enable groups of young people from different countries to come together, live collectively, and collaborate on shared projects for short durations. These exchanges, held outside the school environment, involve a variety of activities such as workshops, exercises, debates, role-plays, and outdoor pursuits. The learning experiences gained during these exchanges are officially recognized through the issuance of a Youthpass.



DiscoverEU

DiscoverEU provides 18-year-old citizens with the chance to explore Europe through enriching learning experiences. Whether traveling predominantly by rail (with exceptions for those residing on islands or in remote areas), participants have the opportunity to discover Europe's diverse landscapes, cities, and towns. As part of the DiscoverEU Inclusion Action, this funding is allocated to support **young individuals facing fewer opportunities** in exploring Europe.

This extra assistance aims to help them overcome obstacles related to application and travel, ensuring inclusivity for those who might not typically apply independently.

Also, DiscoverEU Learning Cycle, offers opportunity to travel short-term in Europe by rail. The program aims to provide individuals aged 18 with the opportunity to explore various landscapes and cities of the continent while promoting independence, self-confidence, and a sense of EU identity. The European Union provides **a travel card** to selected applicants. To participate, applicants must submit their applications through the **European Youth Portal** during the open application period. The selection process is based on a multiple-choice exam and an additional question, with at least 35,000 applicants being selected to participate in the program based on their answers.



Mobility of Youth Workers

ERASMUS facilitates the professional development of youth workers through mobility support for training or networking experiences abroad. These periods encompass activities such as training courses, study visits, job shadowing, and observation periods at relevant organizations. The duration spans from 2 days to 2 months, excluding travel time. To participate, organizations must engage in a collaborative youth mobility project.



Financial support, provided through an EU grant, covers travel expenses and associated costs. Individuals cannot apply directly; organizations submit applications, ensuring active involvement in the mobility and professional growth of youth workers.

This initiative contributes to the development of quality youth work on various levels, including local, regional, national, European, and international spheres. It aligns with the EU Youth Strategy 2019-2027, particularly the European Youth Work Agenda, emphasizing quality, innovation, and recognition in youth work.

VOLUNTEERING serves as a potent avenue for meaningful contributions, solidarity, and aiding communities in need, with individuals making a voluntary commitment to dedicate their time and skills without financial compensation. The programme ensures robust support, covering travel, accommodation, meals, insurance, and providing pocket money for volunteers' needs.

European Solidarity Corps Opportunities

Volunteering: Volunteering offers young individuals the chance to actively contribute to organizations specializing in solidarity activities that benefit communities. These activities can occur either abroad or within the participant's home country. Individual volunteering spans up to 12 months, while team volunteering typically ranges from 2 weeks to 2 months.

Solidarity Projects: The programme places a renewed focus on volunteering and solidarity projects, emphasizing bottom-up activities initiated and executed by groups of young people. These projects aim to address key challenges within their communities.

Humanitarian Aid Strand: Open to individuals aged 18 to 35, this initiative facilitates emergency aid delivery based on principles such as neutrality, humanity, independence, and impartiality. Volunteers play a crucial role in providing assistance, relief, and protection in areas of greatest need, addressing humanitarian challenges in safe third countries associated to the programme where EU humanitarian aid activities are conducted. Comprehensive training ensures volunteers possess the necessary skills and competencies to effectively aid those in need, supported by experienced coaches and experts.











Quality Higher Education Opportunities

Türkiye boasts the second-highest access rate to higher education globally, standing at an impressive 94.2%. As an active participant in the European Higher Education Area, Türkiye meticulously implements the Bologna Process, reflected in our exemplary 5 out of 5 Bologna report rating. This ensures that a diploma obtained from a Turkish university holds recognition across all European countries. Aligning with European standards, Türkiye employs the ECTS course credit system, and all students receive a Diploma Supplement. Furthermore, Türkiye stands out as one of the most successful nations engaged in Erasmus+ exchange programmes, offering additional initiatives like Mevlana and Farabi to support the mobility of both students and lecturers. This commitment to international collaboration underscores Türkiye's dedication to fostering educational opportunities and global connectivity.

University and Programme Diversity

Over the past decade, Turkey has witnessed a significant rise in international students enrolled in its higher education institutions, with current figures exceeding 300 thousand, positioning the country with the highest student population in the European Higher Education Area among its 208 universities (ECHE holders) and a total population of 84 million. Additionally, Türkiye stands among the top 10 countries globally in terms of hosting international students, emphasizing its attractiveness as an international education hub. With this rich academic tapestry, Türkiye provides an extensive and inclusive platform for students seeking diverse educational opportunities.



Natural Beauties

Türkiye, distinguished by its four distinct seasons, has earned global acclaim for its unparalleled natural beauty. 
Student Friendly Environment
