The central scope of our team volunteering activities is to organize activities (summer camps, workshops, games, refugee shelter service) for children forced to flee Ukraine with the support of international volunteers. We would like to grant opportunities for European youth to be actively involved in actions reflecting the needs of Ukrainian families temporarily staying in Hungary.

In this current team volunteering project we would like to involve 10 groups of volunteers, 10-12 participants in each, for 16 days in various activities (facilitating games and programs in summer camps for children and youth, operational support in the shelters, and supporting the establishment of an animal-assisted healing space and green shelters in the countryside), what will contribute to the efforts of local civil society organisations (Migration Aid and Terre des hommes) working on relief and assistance to those Ukrainian families whose lives, livelihoods and communities have been disrupted by the war. We plan to volunteer in 2-3 shelters, in a temporary school and in many summer camps organised for refugee children, so we could contribute to the life of many families (around 1000 refugees or even more).

Project Summary

According to the World Health Organization (WHO, 2020), cancer is one of the leading causes of death worldwide, leading to 10 million deaths in 2020. As a worldwide problem, it is felt in Turkey, accounting for 126 335 deaths in 2020. An increase of 41.31% compared to the 89 400 deaths recorded in 2000 (Globocan, 2020). Both in Turkey and worldwide, one of the most common cancers is lung cancer. In this sense, it becomes relevant to understand which risk factors and behaviours have led to this result.

According to the available data (Cancer research for cancer prevention, WHO, 2020), lung cancer is mainly caused by smoking, which accounts for about 63% of global lung cancer deaths. The same is true in Turkey. About 90% of lung cancer cases emerging in the country are caused by smoking.

Given this scenario, the need to act arises, to inform the population about the harmful effects of smoking, lung cancer prevention and the adoption of healthier lifestyles. This is how this project was born, from the will to reduce the number of smokers in the country and, consequently, to reduce the number of lung cases.

That said, the main objectives are:

1. Raising community awareness on the topic of smoking, lung cancer and healthy lifestyles;
2. Promote solidarity;
3. Reinforce the capacities and international scope of the participating organisations;
4. Promote diversity, Intercultural and inter-religious dialogue and raise young volunteers' awareness and understanding other cultures and countries.

Project Summary

Youth for You targets systematically matters:

symbolic (united effort of West/East Europe)

of capacity buildup (start in Romania of systemic local and national volunteering programs)

of inclusion (making Ukrainians actors of their challenges instead of just victims, alongside youth from other difficult background who can take pride in the solidarity actions undertaken)

and awareness goals (the volunteers become when back home ambassadors of the Ukrainian refugees cause)

This in order to tackle the massive challenge Romania is currently facing to welcome and host in adequate manner the Ukrainian refugees flowing since the start of the Invasion. It does so through the deployment on ground of 10 balanced ($\frac{1}{4}$ for each nationality) and mixed teams of 80 total local Ukrainian, Romanian and upcoming French and German volunteers, half of them Youth with Fewer opportunities (Ukrainian not accounted for). They will lead together on ground efforts towards Ukrainian refugees in local Romanian communities, after an adequate psychosocial, contextual, and skilled oriented (i.e. health, pedagogical issues) training before the start of their mission, followed by a mobility or other youth engagement in Western Europe for those willing, enabling them to later share their experience in countries with less direct impact and contact with the current refugees crisis. Through it we expect initiating the start of local and national systems of full time stipended volunteering in Romania, rendering in the Future the local ecosystem less dependent from the European Solidarity Corps and other European and international funding, as well at the same time providing a sustainable solution to tackling the current crisis. We will also have a massive media and awareness impact (through the symbolism of those joint teams), especially in Western Europe and France and Germany.

Our volunteering teams will mostly have mixed workshops (students, minor refugees, youth) and open events so to promote the above-mentioned interaction.

Above all we meet all the permanent priorities of the program in a combination that aims to improve the society in which disadvantaged young people (refugees) live in.

In Georgia and Armenia, the new generations need support as they find themselves in a situation of vulnerability due to natural and human factors. The volunteers will join two volunteering teams lasting 42 days each, during the summer period of 2024 (from May to August) composed of 20 participants each. The project will enforce collaboration among EU and Non-EU based organizations. The organizations involved are: Amaita Intercultura (coordinating organization and applicant, Italy), Intercultura (France), KIEC European Club (Ukraine), Georgian Youth for Europe (Georgia) and Youth Initiative Center NGO (Armenia).

In Georgia with the partner Georgian Youth for Europe, activities related to the support of ecological migrant communities and vulnerable young people will be implemented in the villages of Gumbati and Kveda Pona, which undergone profound social changes related to the arrival of ecological migrants from the regions of Adjara and Svaneti as consequence of numerous natural disasters. In line with the priorities of the call for 2023, the project's activities will support the communities of ecological migrants through agricultural activities in the bio-farming social enterprise of Kveda Pona and cultural and educational activities aimed at the local youth for them to acquire new skills and improve personal development.

In Armenia with the local partner Youth Initiative Center NGO, the project activities aim to support young Armenians through educational activities organized during summer camps for the promotion of mental health, peace, equal opportunities and human rights. Armenia, like Ukraine, has been facing in the course of many years a difficult political situation linked to the conflict with Azerbaijan. The activities respond directly to the priorities of the call for 2023 as they aim at supporting the young generations affected both directly and indirectly by the consequences of conflict and promote solidarity and personal development of young people.

Project Summary

Modern Odyssey focuses on the journey of volunteer teams over the course of 3 years, as they work to promote solidarity among individual and communities of vulnerable and disadvantaged groups. We aim to do this by visiting a different organisation each week of the programme and support the organisations in developing their initiatives through hands-on work, green practices and other community development tools. We will visit both urban areas (i.e. city initiatives) and rural areas (i.e. eco-communities).

In the first year, the team will focus on the theme of understanding and supporting migrants, refugees, and asylum seekers. In the second year, the focus will shift to addiction recovery and the team will work with individuals seeking to overcome substance abuse. In the final year, the team will support individuals with mental and physical disabilities in their efforts to achieve greater health and wellness.

The goal of the project is not only to foster unity within the communities but also to provide a sense of belonging through the idea of "coming home", in a world where isolation and feeling lost is a prominent challenge. The Volunteering Teams will offer young people the opportunity to develop confidence, critical thinking, and become active citizens in society. As well as, learning to be part of a close-knit team, and taking care of oneself mentally and physically.
